## THE VINEYARD STORY

In 1999, Roger Scommegna planted a 16-acre vineyard on top of Cold Spring Mountain off Signal Ridge Road, 9 miles inland from the Pacific Ocean. Overlooking the picturesque Anderson Valley at an elevation of 2,642 feet, the Signal Ridge Vineyard is the highest altitude grape-growing site in all of Mendocino, Sonoma, and Napa Counties. This unique place with challenging terroir produces some of the most high end singular fruit in the region.

Serial entrepreneur and connoisseur, Roger Scommegna, owns and enjoys numerous businesses throughout Anderson Valley in addition to Signal Ridge Vineyard, including The Boonville Hotel, Table 128 Restaurant, and Bite Hard Apple Cider. He resides with his family just outside of Boonville, CA, where they produce Bucket Ranch Olive Oil and Piment d'Ville ground chile powder.

## TASTING NOTES

In the glass, Signal Ridge 2012 Brut has a bright color like shiny white gold and a nose that unfurls notes of citrus and apricot wrapped into a fondant confection. Breezy crisp minerality on the entry leads to flavors of kumquat marmalade and peach preserves. Bright, refreshing, and finishes dry.
